There should always be a basic toolkit on the boat. This should include:

- Tools for routine engine servicing
- Tools for routine boat work

Some of these tools will be common to both categories. Additionally, a more extensive kit will be needed according to the amount of work you intend doing yourself.

- ☐ Torch (preferably a head torch)
