CHECKLIST: PRE-SAIL ENGINE CHECKS The engine manual will advise, but this is a useful guide:	
	Fuel Check there is enough fuel for the passage & carry a can of spare fuel as well. Use fuel treatment regularly to absorb water from fuel, if necessary, & prevent the growth of diesel bug.
	Engine Engine compartment: Open & look around. Look for oil or water leaks, or loose wires.
	Belts: Check they are sound & tight. Seawater inlet valve: Check it is open & the strainer clear.
	Oil level: Check with the dipstick, but do not overfill. Header tank: Check the fresh water level.
	Fuel pre-filter: Check & drain any water. Put the gearbox in neutral, start the engine, & run it at medium revs to warm it up.
	Check the ahead / astern operation, cooling water discharge, oil pressure & that batteries are charging.
	Stern gland: Check this periodically for leaks while the engine is running. Tighten the grease filler, if there is one, as required.
	Anodes: Check on a regular basis - as often as every two months if the boat is kept in the water.
	Gearbox Oil: Check weekly when the engine is running & is warm.
	At sea Keep an eye on the instruments that monitor oil pressure, temperature & battery charging.
	Check inside the engine compartment occasionally for signs of a leak.
