Chapter 1: Portland Bill to Start Point

p23 West Bay (Bridport)

para 4, line 2 and Chartlet, Dir Fl WRG light, characteristic amend: F.WRG.

p35 River Exe - Approaches

LH Col, para 3, line 9, No 5, amend: No 5, Fl (3) G 5s, line 11, No 6, amend: No 6, Fl (3) R 5s.

The Exe approach channel has moved eastwards and new buoy positions on 10/5/2022 were:

The light sequence for each navigation aid remains the same as published.

p36 Exmouth Marina

RH Col, para 2, Peter Dixon Chandlery amend: Peter Dixon/Seawood Chandlery.

p38 Towards Starcross

LH col, lines 5-8, Visitors buoys, amend: per day or part day, £20 over 40ft, £16 under 40ft.

RH col, para 3, insert new text: Inshore of the moorings, SE of Cockwood on the west side of the channel, a BYB east cardinal buoy Q (3) 10s, lies

close east of wreck remains, (submerged at HW), from the collier *South Coaster* blown ashore on the Pole Sands in a gale in 1943. Pulled off the outer banks and moved into the river she was found to be too badly damaged to repair and has been here in slow decline ever since! Continuing upriver, a new un-numbered starboard-hand buoy *Hinton* Fl (2) G 5s has been established between nos 15 and 17 starboard-hand buoys to indicate the extremity of Bull Hill Bank's ongoing westward expansion into the channel.

p39 Lympstone & Upriver to Turf Lock

RH Col, para 1, lines 6 to 9

Delete: 'before... across the river.'

Substitute: 'from where a 2m high Y SPM buoy Q Fl Y with four smaller Y SPM buoys to the N and E (both Fl Y) are on the N side if of the channel, and S and W (unlit) on S side of the channel, all with a Y cross topmarks. Forming a box around the taller buoy and all clearly marked GAS PIPE LINE NO ANCHORING, they indicate the location of a major the North Sea Gas Pipeline passing under the river bed.'

p66 River Dart – Anchorage, Berthing & Moorings

LH Col, **DHNA 2022 Visitor charges**: Inside Town Jetty: £2.55 per metre plus harbour dues £0.95 per metre. Deep water pontoon islands: £0.95 per metre plus harbour dues £0.95 per metre.

p67 Darthaven Marina

2022 Visitor charge: £2.75 per metre plus harbour dues £0.95 per metre

p68 Noss on Dart Marina

This impressive major extension and rebuild of the former Philip & Sons shipyard is now fully operational and has increased berthing from 140 to



232 berths, which now extend downstream almost as far as the higher ferry! Visitor charge 8.0m-12.6m - £3.75 per metre plus harbour dues £0.95 per metre. Vessels up to 21m LOA can be accommodated on the hammerheads. Ashore, the marinas new 75 ton hoist is the largest on the Dart.

p72, Dittisham, (RH Col) para 3, lines 5/6, after recycling facility, amend: and public conveniences, (20p needed to access!).

p112 Plymouth - Mayflower Marina: overnight charge 2022, £4.00 per metre p115 Queen Anne's Battery Marina: 2022 visitor charge: up to 12.5m £4.20 per metre. p118 Plymouth Yacht Haven: visitor charge: £4.20 per metre.

Chapter 3: Rame Head to The Manacles

p164 Falmouth - Falmouth Haven Marina visitor charge: £4.00 per metre p168 Falmouth Marina: overnight charge 2022, £4.00 per metre

p183 The Upper Reaches To Truro: RH Col, Para 1, lines 2-5,

Delete: 'is a private pontoon... on the pontoon' Insert new text: the Truro Harbour Authority visitors' marina, with toilets and showers, overnight charge 6-12m £25.00, 12-20m £30.00. Outer pontoon is lit Fl R 5s at N and S ends.

Chapter 5: The Isles of Scilly

p229 Scilly from the south Cornish coast LH Col, para 2, last line, Runnel Stone (whistle) amend: (bell).

p239 St Marys – Moorings, Berthings & Anchorages:

Amend RH Col, last para '...visitors' berths, which dry out on a firm sandy bottom...' - Pricing for 2022: up to 40ft £25.50, up to 60ft £30.60. **p240**, LH Col, Para 2, delete: The 39 yellow visitors' moorings...further inshore', and substitute: 'The 38 visitors' buoys lie further to seaward in St Mary's Pool arranged in six trots, the outermost comprising 9 green buoys for up to 60ft

LOA at £26.00 per night, and 29 yellow buoys for up to 40ft LOA at £21.00 per night.'
